

ABOUT THE SHOW:

This show is very important

I can't spend a lot of time talking about this, because I don't want to embarass Zach too much. He doesn't want anyone to think he's pretentious, so please take my word when I say that he's not. With that being said:

Zach is one of the smartest and funniest people I know. In 2016, Zach and I both signed up as writers for a 24 Hour Theatre Festival at Northern Arizona University. I barely knew him, but we had done a lot of improv together for a shot form team called "NAUghty Bits." While I, a closeted queer person struggling with internalized biphobia, made the poor decision to write an absurdist play about bisexuality, Zach was also writing something very stupid.

We only had about 6 hours to write our short plays, and then we went home and slept until show time. Zach's show was, deservedly, saved for last. Gut busting laughter from start to finish. We produced more of his plays for the next three years. A professor of mine described the first production of *Quarter Till Closin'* as "not real theatre."

All of sudden it became necessary to produce "not real theatre."

So now you're here. I want you to enjoy this as much as we enjoy this. As much as I enjoy it. I can't speak for everyone who has ever been involved with Zach's plays, but seeing this happen outside of our small college town is very surreal. There have been so many people over the years who have been responsible for this work, and I want to do right by them.

So we're here. Trying to make you laugh. I hope you like it.
